A Message from The Township Committee

It is with great pride that we present you with the 2021 edition of Wyckoff's award-winning municipal calendar, focusing this year on all the ways, as a community, that we remained **#Wyckoff Strong** while we continued to work and serve the public during the COVID - 19 pandemic.

From our first responder heroes, Ambulance Corps Volunteers, Police Officers, Volunteer Firefighters, Nurses, Doctors, Health Care Workers, to our Public Works, garbage and recycling workers, our Meals on Wheels volunteers, essential grocery and retail store workers and clergy, to acts of kindness performed by many residents and groups, we all learned to function with face coverings, limiting our interactions to no more than 10 minutes, while maintaining 6 feet of social distance and consistently washing and keeping our hands clean.

Restaurants and businesses began conducting business outdoors while residents supported the restaurants through take-out service, outdoor dining and eventually limited indoor dining.

The Wyckoff YMCA led a food drive to support Oasis in Paterson and the Center for Food Action in Mahwah. The Y resumed open-air daycare when permitted and assisted working parents by offering online learning days for school-age childcare. Many residents and organizations also generously volunteered their time fundraising, collecting and donating protective safety supplies, and creating lawn signs thanking local essential workers.

Houses of worship offered services online and then

eventually outdoors when weather permitted. Following guidelines, sports resumed and it was time to “play ball.” The library also stepped up to the plate with door side service, book drop returns and online digital collections, as well as virtual classes, and moved on to limited walk-in service.

Every street in town participated in the weekly Saturday evening “Clap Out” to recognize and thank our first responder heroes and essential workers. Throughout town, backyards and patios became the new entertainment centers as Covid prompted people to move outdoors and get some fresh air. Residents can be seen strolling and cycling outdoors with friends and family and frequenting our local parks such as Russell Farms, the Gardens of Wyckoff and the Wyckoff Environmental Center, while maintaining a safe social distance.

Our volunteer Fire Department and our Police Department were very busy with “drive by” birthday celebrations which, were a hit with our younger residents.

New to our lexicon we added social distancing, main-

taining 6 foot distance, CDC guidelines, pods, face coverings, etc., which have become our new social norm.

This year's sartorial “must-have” accessory became the required face coverings: stripes, prints, plaids, flags, N-95 masks and surgical masks, which adorned our faces.

We began working from home and Zoom calls became a regular means of communication as a reliable platform for video communication for our Township, our local businesses, our schools and for socializing. The Township saw a record number of building permits, with many residents re-inventing their homes during this pandemic time.

Needless to say, our commitment to Wyckoff Strong will only become more steadfast as we head into 2021 and beyond, into an increasingly changed world. As always, we extend our heartfelt gratitude to the local businesses whose advertising support makes this calendar possible. Please show your appreciation by patronizing their businesses.



As the pandemic intensified in the early spring, school systems scrambled to institute remote learning programs as the lockdown went into full effect. The high rate of infections in the tri-state area meant that instruction was going to remain long-distance through the end of the school year.



Healthcare Heroes Food Dropoff
Over 54 Wyckoff Family YMCA volunteers delivered over 3,400 meals to health care workers at Hackensack Meridian Health, Holy Name Hospital, Valley Hospital and the Christian Health Care Center, as well as to the Wyckoff Police, Fire and EMT teams and their counterparts in Franklin Lakes. This program also allowed the YMCA to support over 24 local restaurants, made possible through generous donations made to the Y's charitable fund, Wyckoff Y Cares.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, parents were offered the choice of sending their children to school in person or keeping them home to learn virtually through live-streamed online lessons. Approximately 90% of families selected the in-person model, which operated on a shortened day schedule, with students leaving at lunchtime and resuming classes online at home for the afternoon. The District provided a personal computing device for each student. While all elementary students were offered five days a week of in-person schooling, the students at Eisenhower Middle School were separated into cohorts on an alternating schedule, with half the population attending school each day, and the other half tuning in to their classes from home.






Garbage & Dual Stream Recycling Information

Help Wyckoff Save Tax Dollars

Disposal of household garbage is an important and costly municipal service. Residents can help by increasing recycling – every additional pound of recycling or garbage otherwise kept out of the waste stream generates immediate savings for Wyckoff.

For instance, if you are considering throwing away a sofa, chair, or other large item, consider donating it to a charity or post it on one of the many websites available as an option.

Bring your branches and other garden waste to our Recycling and Conservation Center, where it will be composted. Get a composter – about 30% of the average family's garbage is compostable. Call our recycling information line at 201-891-7000 ext. 101 for information on cost and pick-up of a composter in Wyckoff. Information on this page and on the Recycling/Trash page of our website provides other ideas on reducing your residential garbage "footprint" and helping us to save tax dollars.

Keep Appliances and Metal Bulk Items Out of the Waste Stream

Every Wednesday, the Wyckoff DPW will pick up appliances such as residential room air conditioners, dehumidifiers, stoves and residential refrigerators and freezers (**with doors removed**). Simply call 201-891-7000 ext. 101 to request curbside collection. These appliances may also be brought to the Recycling and Conservation Center, 476 West Main Street. Central air conditioning units are considered construction



material and must be disposed of privately. A building permit must be obtained when replacing or installing central air conditioning systems.

Keeping appliances out of the waste stream is another way of reducing our landfill footprint and improving our recycling rate to help achieve cost avoidance and save tax dollars.

Bring Computers and Electronics to the Recycling/Conservation Center

A walk-in container is available for Wyckoff residents and Wyckoff businesses to recycle computer components and electronic devices. Accepted items include: computers, TVs, monitors, printers, DVD players, scanners, radios, telephones, fax machines and stereo equipment. Call 201-891-7000 ext. 101 for additional information or visit our website at wyckoff-nj.com under Recycling & Trash.

Curbside Garbage Collection

Residents can place the following items at the curb for their household curbside garbage and trash collections:

Table waste should be bagged and placed in a trash container.

Furniture, mattresses, box springs should be placed curbside in dry weather.

Broken mirrors must be taped and placed in trash container.

Trash and recyclables must be placed at the curb prior to 6 a.m. of your pickup day, but not before 6 p.m. of the evening before. Containers must be removed by 7 p.m. of the pickup day.

Residents may place **FOUR** containers per pickup at the curb during the twice-a-week collection schedule and **EIGHT** containers per pickup at the curb during the once-a-week collection schedule. Containers may not be larger than 45 gallons and are not to exceed 50 pounds. **Landscaping barrels may NOT be used because their large size makes them difficult to handle.**

Materials NOT collected in household garbage pickup:

- Electronic equipment
- Household appliances and metal bulk items
- Construction and demolition debris including all types of building materials, as well as rugs and carpet
- Permanent fixtures, such as toilets, sinks, tubs, etc.
- Fences (if metal, bring to Recycling/Conservation Center)
- Swing sets (if metal, bring to Recycling/Conservation Center)

- Aluminum sheds (bring to Recycling/Conservation Center)
- Windows/doors, garage doors
- Grass clippings
- Pianos
- Pool filters and heaters
- Glues and adhesives
- Wood, wood pallets and fireplace wood
- Railroad ties
- Propane tanks
- Fluorescent light bulbs
- Furnaces (ask vendor installing new furnace to take old unit)
- Oil-and water-based paints, shellacs and wood preservatives
- Hazardous waste

Disposal of Construction Materials and Unusual Items

As part of the construction planning process, provisions must be made by the property owner for disposal of these construction-related items. (It is unfair to expect other residents to assume these costs.)

Property owners must comply with Township garbage and recycling regulations when undertaking any renovation or structural alteration of their home. Materials such as cardboard, ferrous scrap and white goods must be recycled and a receipt from the recycling market must be provided prior to receiving a Certificate of Occupancy.

If you are in need of special pickups, Google "Garbage Removal" for a list of private contractors who dispose of construction materials, garage doors, pianos, furnaces, fences or any other unusual items. These private services may also be useful if, due to an impending move or other circumstance, a property owner has a large volume of disposable materials.

If you are installing carpet, new fixtures or appliances, instruct the installer to dispose of the carpet, old appliances or fixtures.

Are you planning a move or emptying your attic, garage or basement? A quick on-line search will provide options for disposal when your volume of trash exceeds the container limits.

- One bin is located at Fire Company 2, 180 Wyckoff Avenue.
- More bins can be found at the Recycling/Conservation Center at 476 West Main Street, which is open daily and on Saturdays.

Vegetative Waste Collection

Vegetative Waste Collection occurs every other Thursday for Districts 2, 3, 6, and 7 and every other Friday for Districts 1, 4, 5, and 8, beginning April 8 and ending October 22. Please refer to the street index for your District.

Medicine Disposal Available

Residents may drop off unused or expired medicine, either prescribed or over-the-counter, at the Wyckoff Police Headquarters in Town Hall at 340 Franklin Avenue. The office is open Monday through Friday, 9:00 am to 4:30 pm, and on Saturdays between 9:00 am and 1:00 pm. Please remove any labels which contain personal information. **Syringes/Epipens not accepted.**

Alternate Pickup

Three Ways to Recycle Your Grass After Mowing

1. As a "green" alternative, consider the "cut it and leave it" approach which will actually benefit your lawn by returning nutrients and organic matter to the soil. Grass clippings returned to the lawn can provide up to 25% of your lawn's total fertilizing needs.
2. Residents also have the option of taking grass clippings to the Recycling and Conservation Center at 476 West Main Street.
3. Home compost your grass. Mix your grass with flowers, leaves and twigs. Turn the pile over at least once or twice a month to foster decomposition and healthier compost. Compost is great for suppressing weeds and holding in soil moisture. Spread a two to four inch layer around the base of plants, adding new layers over time.

Landscapers are not permitted at the Recycling and Conservation Center.



Materials accepted at the Recycling/Conservation Center: glass food or beverage containers, steel cans, aluminum cans, wax-coated paper cartons, plastics #1, 2, and 5* (all other plastics should be discarded in household trash), scrap metals, appliances (**refrigerators and freezers with doors removed, washers, dryers, etc.**), computers and electronics, rechargeable batteries, lawn mowers and snow blowers (without oil, gas or rubber tires), corrugated and single-ply cardboard, newsprint, paperback books, junk mail, magazines, grass, leaves, branches (under 3 inches in diameter), vegetative waste, Christmas trees, clothes, shoes, and hardcover books. Plastic bags of any kind or color are not recyclable. Place them in your trash or return them to the retailer.

Cardboard & Mixed Paper Recycling



- **Newspaper**
- **Cardboard** (flattened)
- **Mixed Paper:** junk mail, magazines, paperback books, cereal boxes, paper bags, catalogs, office paper, and envelopes

Use cardboard boxes, reusable bins or paper bags to hold your cardboard/newspaper/mixed paper recycling.

Paper should be dry. It should not be bound with tape, twine or rope.

Secure containers with a lid, especially on windy and rainy days.

No plastic bags!

No pizza boxes!

All of these items are placed at the curb every other week.

Bottles, Cans and Plastics #1, 2 and 5

- **Steel & Tin Cans**
- **Glass Bottles & Jars** (no lids)
- **Aluminum Cans**
- **Plastic Bottles & Containers** #1, 2, and 5 only (no lids)
- **Coated food/beverage cartons**

Recyclables need to be empty, rinsed, clean, and dry. Items should not be bagged.

No plastic bags!

All of these items are placed at the curb every other week.

The **Recycle Coach** app, available at the App Store or Google Play, is like your virtual personal assistant. Download this **free** app and receive reminders of your next garbage, recycling, and vegetative waste collection dates.

Items Prohibited From Recycling Collection

- NO pizza boxes
- NO polystyrene foam or plastic #6
- NO hardcover books
- NO plastic bags of any kind or color
- NO caps, lids, tops or straws
- NO large metal items
- NO rubber or plastic hoses (i.e. garden hoses or electrical cords)
- NO plastic food trays of any kind
- NO plastics #3, 4, 6 & 7
- NO plastic flower or plant pots
- NO light bulbs or strings of light
- NO disposable coffee cups
- NO food waste or recyclables with food residue
- NO hazardous waste
- NO sharp objects, syringes, needles, or medical waste
- NO styrofoam
- NO vegetative waste
- NO used diapers
- NO wrapping paper

If in doubt, throw it out!

In order to meet the market demand for “clean recyclables” do not place plastic bags and pizza boxes with your recyclables.

Avoid using single-use plastic bags! The best shopping bag is a reusable bag that can be used over and over again. Reusable shopping bags help to reduce litter and pollution, decrease the waste production cycle, and promote sustainability. Best of all, they're cost-effective.
