PLANNING BOARD

The Planning Board reviews and acts on applications for subdivision approval, non-residential site plan approval and conditional use approval. If the application for conditional use involves a variance, the application is referred to the Zoning Board of Adjustment.

The applications are reviewed and a decision is based upon the zoning ordi-

nances established by the Township in accordance with the goals stated in the Wyckoff Master Plan. It is the Board's chief goal to guide the use of lands within the municipality in a manner which protects and maintains the public health, safety and general welfare of the community.

Meetings are generally held on the second Wednesday of each month.

BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

It is the Zoning Board of Adjustment's chief goal to set forth safety and welfare of the community with the objective of conserving the value of property and encouraging the most appropriate use of land throughout the Township.

The Board reviews applications for variances which are, essentially, non-permit-

ted uses, and the Board of Adjustment is empowered to grant exceptions to the zoning ordinances in cases where the literal and rigid interpretation and enforcement of the zoning laws would result in a hardship or injustice.

WYCKOFF VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Wyckoff Volunteer Fire Department consists of three neighborhood fire companies. They are staffed by your neighbors who volunteer their time and energy to serve their community. The Fire Companies are listed below as follows:

- Protection Fire Company #1: Located in Scott Plaza, behind Town Hall.
- Community Engine Fire Company #2: Located on Wyckoff Avenue between Grandview Avenue and Newtown Road.
- Sicomac Engine Company #3: Located on Sicomac Avenue, just south of Russell Avenue.

The history of the Wyckoff Fire Department spans a century of service, from its humble beginnings in 1907 to 2007, by volunteer firefighters who have always given freely of their time, effort, and talent without compensation. From a single fire company, Company No. 1, formed in 1907, to the formation of Company No. 2 in 1938 and Company No. 3 in 1943, the evolution of the Wyckoff Fire Department can be observed by looking back through the history that spans a 100-year of the township's most essential volunteer organization.

WYCKOFF VOLUNTEER AMBULANCE CORPS

The Wyckoff Volunteer Ambulance Corps is comprised of a dedicated group of residents and business operators who selflessly dedicate their time and energy to help their neighbors in a time of need. It is one of the oldest independent volunteer ambulance corps in the State, originally formed in 1929 as the American Legion Ambulance Corps.

The Ambulance Corps is stationed at the corner of Voorhis Avenue and

Woodland Avenue in the Memorial Town Hall complex across from Firehouse #1.

Today, our members are highly trained in emergency medicine and respond 24 hours a day to an average of 1,000 emergency calls per year. In addition to providing emergency care to the residents of Wyckoff, WVAC supports other charitable causes in the community and provides community education on CPR and first aid training.


HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION

The Wyckoff Township Committee recently enacted legislation to create an Historical Preservation Commission. The duties of the nine-member Commission include preparing a survey of historic landmarks in the Township, making recommendations to the Planning Board on the historic preservation section of our Master Plan, and advising our land use boards on applications pursuing de-

velopment of historic properties.

Early in 2019 the Township Committee enacted a new historic preservation ordinance in an effort to safeguard the heritage of Wyckoff by preserving structures, objects, and sites which the Township designates as landmarks.

The ordinance serves as a reasonable balance between the rights of property owners and the public interest in preserving the character of the Township.

The primary objectives are to preserve and maintain Union Cemetery and the historic Barbershop, in addition to offering public programs about Wyckoff and its noteworthy history.

Residents are invited to take a trip into the past when Wyckoff was farmland, mills, and pastures. Read about the early settlers who built the stone houses, churches, schools and businesses. Although most of the farms and pastures are gone, many historic homes remain, tended carefully by current owners, and giving you a peak into Wyckoff's history.

ZABRISKIE HOUSE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Zabriskie House, along with its Early American furnishings, was willed to the Township in 1973 by the late Mrs. Grace Quackenbush Zabriskie, so all residents can enjoy this fine example of our early Dutch heritage.

Located on Franklin Avenue, this New Jersey landmark was originally built around 1730 and is believed to be the oldest building in Wyckoff. Special events and holiday tours are announced in the local newspapers.

Curbside Garbage Collection

Residents can place the following items at the curb for their household curbside garbage and trash collections:

Table waste should be bagged and placed in a trash container.

Trash and recyclables must be placed at the curb prior to 6 a.m. of your pickup day, but not before 6 p.m. of the evening before. The containers must be removed by 7 p.m.

Residents may place **FOUR** containers per pickup at the curb

Materials NOT collected in household garbage pickup:

- Electronic equipment
- Household appliances and metal bulk items
- Construction and demolition debris including all types of building materials, as well as rugs and carpet
- Permanent fixtures, such as toilets, sinks, tubs, etc.
- Fences (if metal, bring to Recycling/Conservation Center)
- Swing sets (if metal, bring to Recycling/Conservation Center)
- Aluminum sheds (bring to Recycling/Conservation Center)
- Windows/doors, garage doors
- Grass clippings
- Pianos
- Pool filters and heaters
- Glues and adhesives
- Wood, wood pallets and fireplace wood
- Railroad ties
- Propane tanks
- Fluorescent light bulbs
- Furnaces (ask vendor installing new furnace to take old unit)
- Oil-and water-based paints, shellacs and wood preservatives
- Hazardous waste

Keep Appliances and Metal Bulk Items Out of the Waste Stream

Every Wednesday, the Wyckoff DPW will pick up appliances such as residential room air (not central) conditioners, dehumidifiers, stoves and residential refrigerators and freezers (**with doors removed**). These appliances can also be brought to the Recycling and Conservation Center, 476 West Main Street. White goods will not be collected in November and December.

Disposal of Construction Materials and Unusual Items

As part of the construction planning process, property owners must comply with Township garbage and recycling regulations when undertaking any renovation or structural alteration of their home. Materials such as cardboard, ferrous scrap and white goods must be recycled and a receipt from the recycling market must be provided prior to receiving a Certificate of Occupancy.

If you are in need of special pickups, Google "Garbage Removal" for a list of private contractors who dispose of construction materials, garage doors, pianos, furnaces, fences or any other unusual items.

Are you planning a move or emptying your attic, garage or basement? A quick on-line search will provide options for disposal when your volume of trash exceeds the container limits.

Save Water in the Home

- Take shorter showers
- Install a low flow toilet
- Turn water off when brushing teeth or shaving
- Install water saving shower heads or low flow restrictors
- Fix leaky faucets & pipes
- Insulate hot water pipes
- Use automatic dishwasher & washing machine for full loads only or adjust water level

Wednesdays & Sundays for properties with even-numbered addresses

Save Water Outside the Home

- Don't leave water running when washing a car or better yet use a car wash service that recycles water
- Water lawns/gardens only when needed- 2x/week for 30 minutes in early am or later pm is best
- Apply mulch around shrubs/flowers helps to reduce evaporation, weeds & promotes growth
- Create a rain garden- use barrels or containers to capture rainfall & reuse

No Irrigation on Monday, Thursdays or Fridays unless using a hand held hose before 10am or after 6pm

Places to Recycle Old Clothes, Shoes, and Books

- Two bins are located behind Town Hall and between the Fire House and the Ambulance Corps buildings. (clothes and shoes only)
- One bin is located at Fire Company 2, 180 Wyckoff Avenue. (clothes and shoes only)
- More bins can be found at the Recycling/Conservation Center at 476 West Main Street, which is open daily and on Saturdays. (clothes, shoes, books, DVDs, CDs)

Vegetative Waste Collection

Vegetative Waste Collection occurs the first Thursday for Districts 2, 3, 6, and 7 and the first Friday for Districts 1, 4, 5, and 8, beginning April 6 and ending October 6. Please refer to the street index for your District.

Medicine Disposal Available

Residents may drop off unused or expired medicine, either prescribed or over-the-counter, at the Wyckoff Police Headquarters in Town Hall at 340 Franklin Avenue. The office is open Monday through Friday, 9:00 am to 4:30 pm, and on Saturdays between 9:00 am and 1:00 pm. Please remove any labels which contain personal information. **Syringes/Epipens not accepted.**

Personal Paper Recycling "Shredfest"

Each year the Township offers a free opportunity for residents to shred their personal paper documents at our Shred Day event. Residents also have the opportunity to recycle their clean, white, dry packing Styrofoam and dispose of unused and expired medicines at the event too. Packing peanuts and food containers are not accepted. Check the website for more info or sign up for our E-News to receive a notice about the event. **In addition, the Recycling/Conservation Center now houses a new secure confidential paper shredding container to drop off your confidential papers year round when the Recycling Center is open.**

Alternate Pickup

Three Ways to Recycle Your Grass After Mowing

1. As a "green" alternative, consider the "cut it and leave it" approach which will actually benefit your lawn by returning nutrients and organic matter to the soil. Grass clippings returned to the lawn can provide up to 25% of your lawn's total fertilizing needs.
2. Residents also have the option of taking grass clippings to the Recycling and Conservation Center at 476 West Main Street.
3. Home compost your grass. Mix your grass with flowers, leaves and twigs. Turn the pile over at least once or twice a month to foster decomposition and healthier compost. Compost is great for suppressing weeds and holding in soil moisture. Spread a two to four inch layer around the base of plants, adding new layers over time.

Landscapers are not permitted at the Recycling and Conservation Center.



Materials accepted at the Recycling/Conservation Center: glass food or beverage containers, steel cans, aluminum cans, coated paper food cartons, plastics #1, 2, and 5* (all other plastics should be discarded in household trash), scrap metals, appliances (**refrigerators and freezers with doors removed, washers, dryers, etc.**), computers and electronics, rechargeable batteries, lawn mowers and snow blowers (without oil, gas or rubber tires), corrugated and single-ply cardboard, newsprint, paperback books, junk mail, magazines, grass, leaves, branches (under 3 inches in diameter), vegetative waste, Christmas trees, clothes, shoes, and hardcover books. Plastic bags of any kind or color are not recyclable. Place them in your trash or return them to the retailer.

*Styrofoam is not permitted



Cardboard & Mixed Paper Recycling



- Newspaper
- Cardboard (flattened)
- Mixed Paper: junk mail, magazines, paperback books, cereal boxes, paper bags, catalogs, office paper, and envelopes

Use cardboard boxes, reusable bins or paper bags to hold your cardboard/newspaper/mixed paper recycling.

Paper should be dry. It should not be bound with tape, twine or rope.

Secure containers with a lid, especially on windy and rainy days.

No plastic bags! Only pizza boxes with no grease stains!

All of these items are placed at the curb every other week.

Bottles, Cans and Plastics #1, 2 and 5

- Steel & Tin Cans
- Glass Bottles & Jars (no lids)
- Aluminum Cans
- Plastic Bottles & Containers #1, 2, and 5 only (no lids)
- Coated food/beverage cartons

Recyclables need to be empty, rinsed, clean, and dry. Items should not be bagged.

No plastic bags!

All of these items are placed at the curb every other week.

Items Prohibited From Recycling Collection

- NO greasy pizza boxes
- NO polystyrene foam or plastic #6
- NO hardcover books
- NO plastic bags of any kind or color
- NO caps, lids, tops or straws
- NO large metal items
- NO rubber or plastic hoses (i.e. garden hoses or electrical cords)
- NO plastic food trays of any kind
- NO plastics #3, 4, 6 & 7
- NO plastic flower or plant pots
- NO light bulbs or strings of light
- NO disposable coffee cups
- NO food waste or recyclables with food residue
- NO hazardous waste
- NO sharp objects, syringes, needles, or medical waste
- NO styrofoam
- NO vegetative waste
- NO used diapers
- NO wrapping paper



A new law in New Jersey went into effect that is designed to reduce single use plastic and paper litter.

What can you do to support **Bag Up NJ**?

- Bring your own reusable shopping bag when you go to the store.
- Recycle your plastic bags at retail stores.
- Decline a straw when offered or bring a reusable straw.

In order to meet the market demand for “clean recyclables” do not place plastic bags and greasy pizza boxes with your recyclables.

Avoid using single-use plastic bags! The best shopping bag is a reusable bag that can be used over and over again. Reusable shopping bags help to reduce litter and pollution, decrease the waste production cycle, and promote sustainability. Best of all, they're cost-effective.
