The Township Committee proceeded with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Mayor Rudolf E. Boonstra.

Open Public Meeting Act Statement:

Township Deputy Clerk Robert J. Shannon read the "Open Public Meeting Act" Statement: "This regular meeting of the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff is now in session. In accordance with the provisions of Section 8 of the Open Public Meetings Act, I wish to advise that notice of this meeting has been posted in the lower level of the Memorial Town Hall and that a copy of the schedule of meetings has also been filed with the Township Clerk, and copies of this agenda and the annual notice of meetings, of which this is a part, have been heretofore sent to the Ridgewood News, The Record, and The North Jersey Herald and News all papers with general circulation throughout the Township of Wyckoff. At least 48 hours prior to this meeting the Agenda thereof was similarly posted, filed and mailed to said newspapers."

Public Comment:

Committeeman Carolan made a motion to open the meeting for public Comment; Seconded by Committeeman Shanley. All voted in favor.

Jennifer Feliciano, 453 Glendale Avenue, Wyckoff – Ms. Feliciano stated that the we are Wyckoff Team accepted a political contribution from developer Ray Springer who received a variance and she asked Mr. Carolan and Mr. Shanley if they will recuse themselves if Mr. Springer comes before the Town now?

Mayor Boonstra indicated her question is a political campaign question and not a government question Mr. Carolan offered to answer her question after the meeting.

Tina Nida, 401 C Bromley Place, Wyckoff – Ms. Nida stated she is on the Spring Meadow Condominium Association Board of Trustees and inquired on a number of matters regarding the Spring Meadow Condominium Association. Administrator Shannon replied that he will provide her with the research he performed regarding whose responsibility it is to maintain the white pine trees closet to the YMCA side of Spring Meadow Road. She inquired on removal of a tree near the stop sign to Pulis Field and a light shield on an outdoor sports lighting pole and requested who to contact for a crosswalk at Spring Meadow Road and Wyckoff Avenue. Mayor Boonstra indicated Mike Varner at the Bergen County Planning Department can be contacted to inquire about a crosswalk.

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Stephen Joern, 363 Butternut Avenue, Wyckoff – Mr. Joern suggested that the residents who signed the petition are requesting for creative alternatives for the selection of the Mayor annually in a manner which is not based on partisan politics. He suggested that the business as usual approach is not acceptable.

#17-266 Extend Contract for Clothes and Shoe Recycling Boxes at Recycling Center

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff awarded a one (1) year contract for clothes and shoe recycling from January 1, 2017 to December 31, 2017 to GSW, Inc. via resolution #16-295; and,

WHEREAS, on October 17, 2017, the Township Committee adopted resolution #17-259 which assigned that contract to the successor of GSW, Inc., which is OGS Recycling LLC; and,

WHEREAS, the bid specifications and the aforementioned resolution of award included language which allows the Township of Wyckoff at its sole discretion to extend the contract for a two (2) year period if the contract has been provided in our efficient and effective manner; and,

WHEREAS, the DPW Manager has recommended the contract extension due to its efficient and effective contract service; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Administrator and Chief Financial Officer concur with this recommendation; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Attorney has approved this procurement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff that a contract is hereby extended to OGS Recycling LLC, 100 Springdale Road, Suite A3, PMB 293, Cherry Hill, New Jersey 08003 for a two (2) year period beginning on January 1, 2018 ending December 31, 2019 for a payment to the Township of \$1,500.0 for each of the four recycling containers /boxes placed at the recycling centers which totals \$6,000.00 to be paid to the Township in 2018 and \$6,000.00 to be paid to the Township in 2019. Said

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payment shall be paid \$3,000.00 each April 1st and \$3,000.00 paid each October 1st.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Municipal Clerk provides a certified copy of this resolution to the Chief Financial Officer, DPW Manager and the Municipal Administrator.

#17-267 **Authority not to consider apparent low bidder due to non-compliance with specification requirements and award Recycling Collection Contract to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder**

WHEREAS, the Township of Wyckoff's curbside solid waste collection, curbside recyclable collection and curbside vegetative waste collection expires on December 31, 2017; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee approved the specifications and authorized bidding on June 20, 2017; and,

WHEREAS, a project team coordinated by the Township Administrator developed the specifications in accordance with the NJDEP uniform specifications for solid waste collection; and,

WHEREAS, a legal advert soliciting competitive sealed bids was published in the August 1, 2017 issue of the Newark Star Ledger (a newspaper circulating in the State of New Jersey) and in the Passaic Herald News, (a newspaper circulating in Bergen County) as required by the NJDEP uniform specifications for solid waste collection; and,

WHEREAS, the Township exceeded the statutory public notice requirement and further encouraged competitive bidding by publishing a third legal notice in the August 1, 2017 issue of the Bergen Record and the Township posted the legal notice soliciting competitive sealed bids on its official website, www.wyckoff-nj.com easily accessed from its home page by clicking "Bids and Jobs" quick link; and,

WHEREAS, in order to further encourage competition the Township provided the 72 page specification and four 24"x18" color collection route maps free of charge; and,

WHEREAS, on October 3, 2017, at 11:00 am, bids were publicly opened and their contents read aloud; the bidders and their prices are detailed on the municipal clerks minutes of the bid opening which are attached as if set forth at length; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff reserved the right as stated in the specification and in the bid advertisement to award contracts based on the lowest responsive and responsible bid per service level or term of contract years it deems to be in the best interest of the taxpayers in accordance with the law; and,

WHEREAS, after careful review, prudent consideration and statement verifications, the Procurement Team recommends the apparent low bidder's proposal not be considered due to multiple non-compliance requirements with the bid specification which makes this bid non-responsive to the specification (pursuant to NJSA 40A:11-2(33)) and recommend award of contract for the recyclable collection service level to the lowest responsive and responsible bidders; and,

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WHEREAS, the apparent low bidder's proposal for the service level, 5. 3.2 – Recyclable Curbside Collection every week – Affordable Cartage, LLC is non-responsive to the bid specification for multiple requirements, which include:

1. The Township Administrator's 10/10/17 memo to the Township Attorney which is attached as if set forth at length. This report explains eight (8) areas of non-compliance with the specification; and,
2. The Borough Administrator of Franklin Lakes e-mail, (attached as if set forth at length) which indicates that Centurion Carting, Inc. has a NJDEP 901 license to cart away their own debris from construction sites which is a different approval than an approval to transport residential curbside garbage collection; and,
3. The Wyckoff Administrator's 10/24/17 letter to Mr. Mazziotta is attached as if set forth at length which details three (3) primary areas of the Affordable Carting, LLC bid proposal which are not responsive to the bid specification requirements; and,
4. During a meeting with the Township Administrator on 10/17/17, representatives from Affordable Carting, LLC stated that Affordable Carting, LLC was formed on 7/1/17 and advised the Administrator Affordable Carting, LLC does not have any municipal clients and their vehicles are still at the dealership, preventing a rational and reasonable inspection and performance verification to determine if Affordable Carting, LLC is able to provide this core public health service for almost 6,000 Wyckoff customers spread over 120 miles of roads not feasible; and,
5. The Township Committee adopted Resolution #17-79 (attached as if set forth at length) at its Reorganization Meeting on 1/1/17 which establishes municipal policy regarding the Township Committee's opinion of the importance and critical nature of unconditional surety bonds and the value of prudently rated surety bonds and certificates of insurance for municipal services to ensure bidders have the financial capacity to carry out services to taxpayers without interruption via advertised competitively sealed bidding; and,
6. The Affordable Cartage, LLC's bonding company has a single bond underwriting limitation of \$354,000 as of the US Treasury's July 1, 2017 Circular 520 and the annual bonding requirement for this procurement is in excess of \$354,000; and,

WHEREAS, the judicial interpretations of the competitive bidding statutes consistently conclude that the bidding statutes exist for the benefit of the taxpayers and not for the aggrandizement of bidders; and,

WHEREAS, the Township has an obligation in accordance with the NJDEP Solid Waste Collection Specifications to review bids to verify the service can be provided through compliance by all bidders playing by the rules of the specification which are critical for the public health function of this service, the requirements guard against bidders targeting contracts they cannot perform when their bid is missing auto insurance, no workers compensation insurance, no employees, trucks have not been delivered and the bonds and certificate of insurance with minimal ratings are often a sign of undercapitalization, no ability to verify performance of staff or more importantly the necessary equipment when a limited number of trucks experience mechanical breakdowns; and,

WHEREAS, it is the recommendation of the Project Team that the Township Committee not consider the bid proposal of Affordable Carting, LLC for all the reasons set forth in this resolution and the attachments as if set forth at length as

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a non-responsive bid in accordance with NJSA 40A:11-1 et seq., NJSA 40A:11-2(33); and,

WHEREAS, the Project Team recommends that the Township Committee award a contract for service level 5. 3.2 – Recyclable Curbside Collection every week to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, Gaeta Recycling Company, Inc.; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Attorney has reviewed this procurement and concurs with this recommendation; and,

WHEREAS, in accordance with NJSA 40A:11-15(3) this contract is for a term not exceeding five (5) years and it is subject to the availability and appropriation annually of sufficient funds on January 1, 2018, January 1, 2019, January 1, 2020, January 1, 2021 and January 1, 2022 and subsequent annual budgets as required and in accordance with recently enacted regulations requiring certification of funds. The budgetary accounting encumbrance process as set forth in NJAC 5:30-5.3(c) and 5:30-5.4(b) for each fiscal year shall take the place of, and be used instead of, written certification of available funds as set forth in NJAC 5:3-5.4(a).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey that:

- 1.) The bid from Affordable Cartage, LLC is not considered for an award due to the multiple areas of non-compliance with the bid specification requirements which make it non-responsive (NJSA 40A:11-2(33)).
- 2.) That the Township Committee deems it in the best interest of the taxpayers to award contracts based on the lowest price per service level and that a contract for every week curbside collection of recyclables – service level 5.3.2 is awarded to Gaeta Recycling, Inc., 278-282 Railway Ave, Paterson, New Jersey, 07503, the lowest responsive and responsible bidder in compliance with the complete specifications and contract as follows:

#17-271 Declare November Pancreatic Awareness Month and encourage all to learn the signs and symptoms of Pancreatic Cancer

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer is one of the deadliest cancers and is the fourth leading cause of cancer death in the United States; and,

WHEREAS, when symptoms of pancreatic cancer present themselves, it is usually too late for an optimistic prognosis, and 75 percent of pancreatic cancer patients die within the first year of their diagnosis while 94 percent of pancreatic cancer patients die within the first five years; and,

WHEREAS, in 2017 about 53,670 people (27,970 men and 25,700 women) will be diagnosed with pancreatic cancer; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee would like to encourage people to learn the signs and symptoms of pancreatic cancer; and,

WHEREAS, no screening tests have been shown to lower the risk of dying from this cancer; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor’s Wellness Campaign, which is available on Facebook, frequently lists useful and timely prevention measures to maintain good health; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey that the month of November 2017 be designated as Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month, and the Township Committee seeks to increase awareness of the signs and symptoms of pancreatic cancer, and encourages its residents and all citizens to seek medical treatment when symptoms indicative of pancreatic cancer present themselves.
