# **Meeting Called To Order**

Mayor Rudolf E. Boonstra called the regular meeting of the Wyckoff Township Committee in the Municipal Court Room to order at 8:00 pm.

#### Flag Salute

The Township Committee proceeded with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Mayor Rudolf E. Boonstra.

#### Invocation

The Invocation was given by Reverend Fred Provencher from Cornerstone Church.

#### Attendance

#### **Open Public Meeting Act Statement:**

Township Clerk Joyce Santimauro read the "Open Public Meeting Act" Statement: "This regular meeting of the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff is now in session. In accordance with the provisions of Section 8 of the Open Public Meetings Act, I wish to advise that notice of this meeting has been posted in the lower level of the Memorial Town Hall and that a copy of the schedule of meetings has also been filed with the Township Clerk, and copies of this agenda and the annual notice of meetings, of which this is a part, have been heretofore sent to the Ridgewood News, The Record, and The North Jersey Herald and News all papers with general circulation throughout the Township of Wyckoff. At least 48 hours prior to this meeting the Agenda thereof was similarly posted, filed and mailed to said newspapers."

#### **Public Comment**

Committeeman Carolan made a motion to open the meeting for public Comment; Seconded by Committeeman Shanley. All voted in favor.

Vincent Tortorelli, 39 Princeton Avenue. Mr. Tortorelli said he was at the meeting on behalf of Steven Joern who could not attend this meeting and to follow up on the petition (requesting a study on the process of electing the Wyckoff mayor) that was presented to the Township Committee last month.

Mr. Tortorelli referenced Mayor Boonstra's comments from this evening's regular work session meeting that that the two person committee would consist of Committeeman Scanlan and another member of the Township Committee (the other member of the Township Committee has not yet been determined), and at the next Township Committee meeting the subcommittee would be announced.

Mr. Tortorelli asked if the recommendation of the subcommittee would be made public. Mayor Boonstra said that the subcommittee would make a report. The Mayor responded that regarding the subcommittee report on the selection of the Mayor, that the Township Committee will strive to be transparent as they always are.

Mayor Boonstra thanked Mr. Tortorelli for his comments.

Committeeman Carolan made a motion to close the public comment time of the regular business meeting; Seconded by Committeeman Shanley with an affirmative vote.

#### **Township Committee Discussion**

Committeeman Scanlan asked that item (e), under the Motions section of this Consent Agenda be removed. Item (e) read: "Approve the appointment of Celeste Homaychak to the Wyckoff Environmental Commission 9/5/17-12/31/19".

Mayor Boonstra replied that two (2) members of the Township Committee interviewed Celeste Homavchak.

Committeeman Scanlan said he learned of this appointment when he got the agenda.

Committeeman Madigan said there has been an opening in the Environmental Commission for over a year and all the Township Committee got a copy of this application when it came in. Mrs. Homaychak has a tremendous background of over ten years on the Environmental Commission in New Milford and on the Green Team & KPMG. She has great credentials. Committeeman Madigan said He had issues with Committeeman Scanlan's method of choosing people for Boards and commissions.

Committeeman Shanley added that Mrs. Homaychak has a lot of great ideas for the Environmental Commission and that the Environmental Commission often times does not have a quorum. Committeeman Shanley said that based on his interview with Mrs. Homaychak that he supports her appointment to the Environmental Commission. It's rare to interview a resident who has experience on a board or commission and Committeeman Shanley added that Committeeman Scanlan should like her.
