MORE OPPORTUNITIES AND ITEMS TO RECYCLE CLOTHING & SHOES

The Wyckoff Township Committee after utilizing the competitive bidding process receives payments from two vendors who have placed their bins for residents to deposit clothing and shoes. This additional recycling opportunity is located conveniently around town.

WHERE TO DROP-OFF CLOTHES & SHOES

- 1. The Township's Recycling & Conservation Center at 476 West Main Street, a popular and convenient destination with its Saturday hours (9am to 3 pm) and Tuesday evening hours (6-8 pm from May 1 through September 30) is available for residents to deposit their recyclables, now includes bins to accept old clothes and shoes which benefit AMVETS.
- 2. In Scott Plaza behind Town Hall and between the Fire House #1 and the Ambulance building are two bins, one painted red with the Universal Fire Department symbol and the other painted white with the Universal First-Aid symbol. Residents who drop-off their clothing and shoes by depositing them in these bins will help the Fire Department and the Ambulance Corps fund State mandated safety equipment which is used to respond when residents call for their help.
- 3. Next to Fire Company #2 at 180 Wyckoff Avenue there is a second red bin with the Universal Fire Department symbol. Residents who deposit their old clothes and shoes in this bin will also help the Wyckoff Volunteer Fire Department fund State mandated safety equipment which is used to respond to resident calls for assistance.

These two locations provide convenient locations for residents to drop-off clothing and shoes to help our two volunteer emergency response services that protect the public.

Due to the slump in the economy, the decrease in revenues and the State imposed caps, the Township explores areas to generate non-tax revenue that can partially relieve a portion of the tax burden.

Anytime of the year is an excellent time to clean your closets of unwanted or outdated clothes and shoes. Recycling your old clothes and shoes is another way of reducing the amount of curbside trash collection. By reducing your residential garbage "footprint" through recycling your used or unwanted clothing or shoes, you help the Township save tax dollars. You also help preserve the environment by recycling these items.

Please do not leave clothing or shoes outside the bins. Help us recycle and decrease the amount of trash you place at the curb.
