# Trex Plastic Film Recycling Challenge

## **Background**

- The Trex Plastic Film Recycling Challenge is a plastic film collection that takes place in a designated town for a six-month period
- Goal: collect 500 lbs of plastic film (equates to about 40,500 plastic bags!!)
- Prize → A high-performance composite bench made from recycled plastic will be donated to our community from Trex



## **Examples of Recyclable Plastic Film**

- Stretch film & pallet wrap
- Bubble wrap
- Grocery bags
- Case overwrap
- Bread bags
- Dry cleaning bags
- Newspaper sleeves
- Produce & Cereal bags
- Paper towel / toilet paper overwrap
- Ziploc or food storage bags
- Ice bags (DRY without metal clips)
- Mattress bags
- Wood pellet bags























## Don't Toss That Plastic Bag In The Garbage - Recycle Right!

### Our Goals

- To reduce the amount of plastic being buried in landfills since landfills play a major role in the destruction of our environment
- Educate people why recycling is a better choice to increase participation and enthusiasm in the challenge
- Show how plastic waste can find a second life in the form of high-performance Trex composite decking
- Help prevent littering

### ➤ Why?

- Plastic bags/film are detrimental to the environment
- Takes a very long time to biodegrade and pollutes the soil
- Encourage good recycling habits and motivate residents to recycle more



## Communicate, Collect, Consolidate

- → Communicate How was the challenge promoted?
  - Flyers
  - Wyckoff Township e-newsletter
  - Social Media Wyckoff Moms, Wyckoffians, Library, and Township Facebook pages
  - Websites Wyckoff Environmental Commission
- → Collect Where were collection sites set up?
  - Wyckoff Public Library
  - Wyckoff Recycling Center
  - Volunteers picked up plastic from collection sites & delivered to Mrs. Fischer's home or my home for weighing and recording.
     Any plastic that did not meet the criteria for being recyclable was removed.
- → Consolidate What did we do with all of this plastic?
  - ◆ Transferred plastic to Stop & Shop. Trex picked up plastic and took it to their recycling center to transform it into a Trex bench.


## Informative Posters to Promote the Event
