#### #18-238 <u>National Immunization Awareness Month</u>

**WHEREAS**, vaccines have aided in reducing the burden of widespread and often fatal diseases, enabling individuals to lead longer and healthier lives while reducing health care costs; and,

**WHEREAS**, although attention has been paid to the importance of childhood vaccinations, there is a general lack of awareness of adult-recommended vaccines and a misperception that adult vaccinations are unnecessary for those who are healthy; and,

**WHEREAS,** adult vaccine preventable diseases, including diseases such as influenza, shingles and pneumonia are important public health issues in the United States; and,

**WHEREAS,** according to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), influenza and pneumonia represent the eighth leading cause of death among adults in the Unites States who are aged 65 years or older; and,

**WHEREAS**, as the population across the United States continues to age, the impact of vaccine preventable diseases on adults will likely increase; and,

**WHEREAS**, the CDC states that vaccine preventable diseases can result in complications for adults with chronic conditions, including long term illnesses, hospitalization and death; and,

**WHEREAS**, the CDC currently recommends a variety of vaccines for adults aged 18 and older, including some recommendations that are universal and others that are targeted to individuals of a certain age, with specific risk factors, or who may have missed certain childhood vaccines; and,

**WHEREAS**, the CDC has consistently seen adult vaccination compliance fall below targets and aims to increase compliance for influenza and pneumococcal vaccination in adults as part of its Healthy People 2020 goals.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, do hereby recognize the month of August as *National Immunization Awareness Month.* 

#### #18-239 <u>Declare September as Childhood Cancer Awareness Month</u>

**WHEREAS,** Although rare, childhood cancer is the leading cause of death from disease in American children under the age of 19 and the second leading cause of death after accidents; and

WHEREAS, Very little is known about the causes of childhood cancers but a small percent are known to be hereditary conditions or exposure to diagnostic or therapeutic radiation; and

**WHEREAS**, 10,590 estimated new cases of childhood and adolescent cancer are projected to be diagnosed in 2018; however, because of major treatment advances in recent decades, more than 80% of children with cancer now survive 5 years or more; and

**WHEREAS,** The effects of childhood cancer therapy can have profound physical, emotional and other consequences; and

**WHEREAS,** Many survivors and children battling the disease have difficulty readjusting in school and social settings, and many children experience anxiety, body image concerns and are at risk for developing learning difficulties; and

**WHEREAS,** There is a need to increase awareness, understanding and compassion among youth for children battling cancer; and

**WHEREAS**, The State of NJ has already adopted resolution AJR 106 SJR 49 designating September of each year as "Go Gold for Kids with Cancer Awareness Week"; and

**WHEREAS**, Rebecca Salmis, a 5<sup>th</sup> grader at Sicomac Elementary School in Wyckoff beat cancer and is active in bringing awareness to cancer, assisting other children with cancer and raising money for cancer research and cancer patients; and

WHEREAS, Wyckoff resident and child, Peyton Sargenti courageously fought childhood cancer and is now in remission; and

WHEREAS, Tommy Fitzpatrick, a brave 6 year old local boy has been strong in his battle against brain cancer and despite having 7 brain surgeries managed, with his family, to raise \$50,000 for pediatric cancer research for the Children's Cancer Institute at Hackensack Medical Center with the "# Tommy Strong" campaign through St. Elizabeth's Church in Wyckoff; and

**WHEREAS**, Wyckoff is still mourning the sad untimely death of Ben Landel, a beloved Wyckoff, resident and former Ramapo High School student to a rare form of childhood cancer; and
