Open Public Meeting Act Statement

Municipal Clerk Santimauro read the "Open Public Meeting Act" Statement: "This regular meeting of the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff is now in session. In accordance with the provisions of Section 8 of the Open Public Meetings Act, I wish to advise that notice of this meeting has been posted in the lower level of the Memorial Town Hall and that a copy of the schedule of meetings has also been filed with the Township Clerk, and copies of this agenda and the annual notice of meetings, of which this is a part, have been heretofore sent to the Ridgewood News, The Record, and The North Jersey Herald and News all papers with general circulation throughout the Township of Wyckoff. At least 48 hours prior to this meeting the Agenda thereof was similarly posted, filed and mailed to said newspapers."

Meeting Open for Public Comment

Committeeman Shanley made a motion to open the meeting for public Comment; Seconded by Committeeman Scanlan. All voted in favor.

Mayor Madigan: "This is the public comment time, if you were in line before please come forward one at a time with anyone else who would like to make a comment. If everyone could please be very respectful again like you were in our work session of all the speakers so we can hear them and give them the respect they deserve."

Melanie Grace Marcus, 388 Atwood Place. Melanie Marcus said she was founding member of Junior State of America at Ramapo High School, a member of the GSA and a member of the Affirming Community at Grace United Methodist Church. Melanie spoke toward the township's public policies and felt that failure to fly the Pride flag would weaken the integrity of the township policies.

Anna Wong, Paramus, NJ. Anna Wong asked the Township Committee to reconsider their choice not to fly the Pride flag, because the Pride flag flying in the home town of LGBTQ children can give them the hope to make it through another day, it can literally be a matter of life and death. Community acceptance is essential. Anna Wong asked the committee to please fly the Pride flag.

Andrew Pfund, 511 Fieldstone Terrace. Andrew Pfund said he attends Ramapo High School and is a member of GSA. Andrew Pfund is fearful of bullying due to his sexual orientation and requested support from the town by flying the Pride flag in support of the LGBTQ community.

Melanie Melinger, 720 Laurel Lane. Melanie Melinger said all groups should feel included in Wyckoff and that can be expressed by flying the Pride flag. Melanie Melinger asked that the Pride flag be flown so we can all be proud of our town.

Aurora McNally, 617 Lawlins Road. Aurora McNally said she is a school teacher at Ramapo High School. She said that 42% of transgender Americans have attempted suicide and the Pride flag needs to be flown for the LGBTQ children so they know they are protected and loved.

Mayor Madigan asked if the Pride flag was flown at Eisenhower School or other schools in town. Aurora McNally said she did not know.

Melanie Marcus asked the Township Committee not to take precedence from Wyckoff's School Boards' decision.

Caroline Simone, 179 Fox Hollow Road. Caroline Simone said when LGBTQ people see the Pride flag flying they know it is a place where they are welcomed and supported. Caroline Simone asked that the Pride flag be flown to send this welcoming message to vulnerable members of our community especially children and teens.

Dana Maloney, 294 Meadowbrook Road. Dana Maloney said she and her brother grew up in Wyckoff, her brother was bullied throughout school and will not live in Wyckoff today, because he felt he was not accepted in Wyckoff. The Pride flag would send a welcoming message to LGBTQ residents.

Beth Sparozic, 319 Calvin Court. Beth Sparozic said she often speaks at Board of Education meetings, she said she thought she lived in a progressive town and questioned the statements made by the Township Attorney regarding public forum on government property. Beth Sparozic asked if LGBTQ was part of the school curriculum and she urged that the Pride flag be flown in front of town hall otherwise we are sending a mixed message to the LGBTQ children. The Pride flag belongs at town hall, not behind shrubs at the Larkin House

Mayor Madigan said the township is making an expression of support with the resolution supporting Pride month, hanging the rainbow ribbons around town hall and by placing the banner on the Larkin House property.

Sara Derico, 190 Wyckoff Avenue. Sara Derico said that the petition in support of the Pride flag being flown at Town Hall now has 1,033 signatures and an updated copy will be given to the township clerk tomorrow.

Lisa Eidel, 408 Buckingham Circle. Lisa Eidel questioned the public forum as explained by the Township Attorney earlier and suggested "commemorative months" like Woman's History Month, African American History Month, Pride Month and write it into law that these will be the only flags that will be flown on the Town Hall front lawn. Manchester New Hampshire had a similar issue with flags and the mayor there asked for the use of flag poles on city property that four (4) particular designated flags be flown from the list of Library of Congress commemorative flags only.

Mayor Madigan said that the subcommittee of himself and Melissa Rubenstein were going to investigate other possibilities.

Attorney Landel said to Lisa Eidel he would speak to her during the meeting and after the meeting again if she would like. Attorney Lander said even with designated flags there is a potential for litigation by creating a public forum. The Township Attorney said Town Hall is where government does its business, we do not want to interrupt the business of our government.

Mayor Madigan said he and Committeewoman Rubenstein will look into options with guidance from Mr. Landel.

Rocky Silver, 291 Monroe Avenue. Rocky Silver is a new resident and a professional actor and said the Pride flag represents hope to the LGBTQ community. He wants to bring up his sons in a world of hope. Rocky Silver would like the Pride flag hung at town hall where town business is done. We should not succumb to fear and hate crimes we should rally together and be proud to live here.

Debby Maloney, 294 Meadowbrook Road. Debby Maloney said that the price of a LGBTQ child's life does not have the same implications as a public forum. Debbie Maloney's son will not come back to Wyckoff because he was not accepted here. Debbie Maloney said the township committee was elected to represent the people, the 1,000 plus people who signed the petition and that the

Pride flag should be flown at town hall.

Patricia Miller, 309 Squawbrook Road. Patricia Miller is a resident of Wyckoff and is the Tax Collector in Glen Rock. Glen Rock has been flying the Pride flag in front of Glen Rock's Town Hall for three (3) years and there has been no disruption to government business at Town Hall. Patricia Miller was in favor of flying the Pride flag at Town Hall in Wyckoff.

Reverend Joseph Schattauer-Paille' from Advent Lutheran Church. Reverend Joseph said that in his opinion with Wyckoff's religious holiday display the town already has a public forum, that he has a crèche at his church and suggested the town fly the Pride flag and make our town a more welcoming place.

Attorney Landel said as a result of previous litigation it was decided to make certain the Town Hall property was not a public forum. Our holiday display is secular in nature and not a public forum.

Carla Pappalardo, 717 Birchwood Drive. Carla Pappalardo wanted to enter some facts into the record, she said how could a crèche and a menorah be secular?

Mayor Madigan asked for clarification of secular. Township Attorney Landel replied that a crèche and menorah alone are not secular, the town also has other holiday figurines like Dickens carolers, ice skaters and a statement that says "it's the holiday season regardless of people's beliefs or disbeliefs".

Carla Pappalardo said she is also an attorney and is having a hard time distinguishing between the Christmas and Chanukah displays and that they symbolize the holidays. She learned in law school the fallacy or logical fallacy of the slippery slope argument; she felt it was a back room discussion and a fearful commentary. Rutherford, Ridgewood, Westwood, Clifton, Englewood, Glen Rock, Haledon, Leonia, New Milford, Rochelle Park, Tenafly and Waldwick also fly the Pride flag. Midland Park had a display in their public library along with a Proclamation. She asked why the committee is afraid to take a step in their direction when the audience is full this evening pleading and petitioning for the town to fly the Pride flag. Carla Pappalardo asked the committee to be empathetic and inclusive and not include legal fees when asked to fly the Pride flag.

Mayor Madigan asked Carla Pappalardo if she flies a flag at her home. Carla Pappalardo replied no flag, but she had been given a rainbow ribbon and she has that at her house on a tree and the small plastic flags in her flower pots. She said we can do whatever we want on our property.

Motion to close the public hearing made by Committeeman Shanley. Seconded by Committeewoman Rubenstein. All voted in favor.

Committeeman Scanlan gave the clerk a letter from a resident Merry Dietz that will be part of the record and he read the following:

"I am writing as a proponent of flying the Rainbow flag in our town. I am a Christian, a registered Republican, which shouldn't matter, but I'm sure it does in this case, and the proud mom of a gay son who came out to us several years ago after graduating from Indian Hills High School. My son said that he had struggled for years with his sexuality trying to conceal it from everyone because he was afraid of rejection and exclusion in his school, his community, his church and in his family.

Pride month is not about flaunting sexuality, it's about celebrating the liberation of so many folks who in the past have been forced by society, and a lot of times by

their own family, to live lives that do not reflect who they truly are. In too many cases these lives have ended too soon in tragedy.

I respectfully ask that you our leaders show the surrounding towns and the world that we stand with our marginalized sisters, brothers, sons and daughters, neighbors and friends in celebrating their lives. That we see them, that they are no longer invisible and we welcome them into our vibrant community to use their gifts and graces to make this world a better place. God knows we need more empathy and compassion in this world right now. Wyckoff is a good place to start."

To our Town Councilmen of Wyckoff,

I am writing as a proponent of flying a rainbow flag in our town.

I am a Christian, a registered Republican (which shouldn't matter, but I'm sure it does, in this case) and the proud mom of a gay son, who came out to us several years ago, after graduating from Indian Hills High School. My son said that he had struggled for years with his sexuality, trying to conceal it from everyone because he was afraid of rejection and exclusion; in his school, in his community, in his church and in his family.

In my personal journey over the ensuing years, through my work at our church, Grace UMC, in Reconciling Ministries, and a family support group that I hold once a month, I have met and established relationships with many people whose identities are lesbian, gay, transgender, bisexual and genderqueer, as well as their family members. These people are in our community, in our churches, in our homes here in Wyckoff. They are among the unnoticed, the invisible, the oft-times excluded people in our society and I believe that it is time we as a traditionally, white, hetero-normal, conservative community publicly show empathy for those on the fringes and let them know that we see them, we love them and we embrace them; for who they are, the gifts they have been given, the lives they are already living in our midst and contributions they are making to our community.

Pride month is not about flaunting sexuality. It is about celebrating the liberation of so many folks who in the past have been forced by society and a lot of times their own families, to live lives that do not reflect who they truly are. In too many cases, these lives have ended much too soon in tragedy. I have spoken with people who have struggled with severe depression, alcoholism and drug abuse as well as suicide attempts because of self-hatred. Sexuality is not simply about sex. It is about the way we express ourselves and how we love other people. It is time that we as a community show our true colors and our celebration of the beautiful diversity in our town of Wyckoff.

I respectfully ask that you as our leaders, show the surrounding towns and the world (after all, we are already on social media) that we stand with our marginalized sisters, brothers, sons and daughters, neighbors and friends in celebrating their lives. That we see them, they are no longer invisible, and we welcome them into our vibrant community to use their gifts and graces to make this world a better place. God knows we need more empathy and compassion in this world right now. Wyckoff is a good place to start.

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Division of Alcoholic Control has instituted a new web based licensing system, POSSE ABC, the new online web portal is for Municipal Clerks and Licensees to electronically renew/amend/transfer liquor licenses online; and,

WHEREAS, the Municipal Clerk has verified on POSSE ABC that the electronic 2019/2020 liquor license renewal application and electronic payment of \$200.00 to the State of New Jersey Department of ABC have been completed by the licensee; and,

WHEREAS, the \$2,500.00 municipal annual liquor license renewal fee has been paid to the Township of Wyckoff and the State of New Jersey Tax Clearance Certificate pursuant to P.L. 1995, Chapter 161 has been issued and verified by the Municipal Clerk; and,

WHEREAS, the Municipal Clerk has requested reports from the Police Department, Fire Prevention Bureau and Sanitarian in conjunction with said renewal application that are attached as if set forth in length.

WHEREAS, the Municipal Clerk has reviewed the on line renewal application, fees, tax clearance certificate and reports and find them to be in proper order; and,

WHEREAS, no written objections have been received by the Municipal Clerk regarding the renewal of this liquor license.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff, that the recommendation of the Municipal Clerk is hereby accepted, and renewal of the Plenary Retail Consumption Liquor License of JMJ, Inc. located at 359 Sicomac Avenue, Wyckoff, NJ is hereby approved subject to the following conditions:

1. The licensed premises shall be restricted to the existing building commonly known as "The Barn."
2. The Barn Original shall not be open prior to 4:00 p.m. on the days that the Sicomac School is in session.
3. No outside storage.
4. Parking as per the approved Planning Board site plan only.
5. The Barn must remain in compliance with the Court Order dated February 4, 1977 which is attached as if set forth at length.
6. Upon the advice of the Township Attorney, and subject to the general provision that all liquor license holders shall notify the Police Department, in writing, within seven (7) days of hiring, of any new or additional employees who may be serving alcoholic beverages, so that they can be scheduled to participate in the Police Department training program regarding administration of the Alcoholic Beverage Commission laws of the State of New Jersey as soon as possible and subject also to the applicable specific conditions herein set forth.
7. The one (1) barrier free parking space must remain with the code compliant ADA sign, the penalty placard and van accessible placard.

WHEREAS, the Township of Wyckoff takes pride in recognizing diversity and welcomes people of all races, religions, genders and sexual orientation; and,

Would that be acceptable?"

Mayor Madigan: "Several people have commented that in their opinion that Stigma Free is part of this. Why are we striking it? I certainly wouldn't have an objection to adding additional language, but I'm confused why we would strike this. Could you explain?"

Committeeman Scanlan: "Stigma Free is a resolution that we approve each January 1. It concerns the designation of individuals who suffer from mental illness and alcoholism and drug addiction as people that should be treated without stigma, so that they could seek help for their problems."

Mayor Madigan: "That's also your opinion, several people tonight have commented on Stigma Free, I don't know which direction to go in. It appears you want to eliminate Stigma Free, when several people spoke tonight that the two are linked. Which one is it? What do the other members of the governing body think?"

Committeeman Shanley: "I don't have a problem striking Stigma Free from the resolution if it gives the unfortunate stigma that we are placing that on the LGBTQ, which is not a stigma. I have no problem striking it from this resolution."

Committeeman Boonstra: "If Brian wants to strike it, and I understand his reasoning here, I don't have a problem with it. As the Mayor points out, we have heard maybe a dozen members from the audience, when they have made their thoughtful comments and somehow bring the Stigma Free designation into their feelings. I wouldn't want to shun what they have said just to abide by the strict reason that we declare Wyckoff Stigma Free. I do understand your argument, we don't want to in any way shape or form indicate that the LGBTQ folks have a mental problem. I think that's what you are saying, am I not right?"

Committeeman Scanlan: "I can only state that, because I was involved in the drafting of the second time we passed the Stigma Free resolution, and understood very much in detail what it was about that I would not like it to be attached to this."

Mayor Madigan: "Is there some way to combine this so you will find it acceptable and nobody is offended?"

Committeewoman Rubenstein: "As the author of the resolution, it was absolutely not my intention to link Stigma Free to the LGBTQ community. My intention was later down in the third whereas to cite the statistics of suicide attempts. That was absolutely my intention. I'm happy to strike this. I hope that when we come back to Stigma Free, I serve on the Board of Health and we do a lot with Stigma Free, in practice it is about being Stigma Free, so if the language is currently restricted to mental health, alcoholism, drug abuse I personally would like to see the language expanded so that Stigma Free can mean what the members of our audience have spoken to us about tonight. In terms of this, if we need to strike it that's fine with me."

Committeeman Shanley: "Yes, I'd like to make additional comments. I've been moved by a lot of your comments tonight. I wish these comments would have come along in May, because we would have had a little more time to do this. I drove around town today looking for a place where the flag could fly. Unfortunately, at the Larkin House the pole for the flag pole fell down, it wasn't there. So, I would much rather have it flying high so everybody could see it. I don't think I understood that a flag means more than a banner, and if it does and if it saves one child's life and if our inaction hurts one child I could not live with myself. So for that reason I support the flag. We will figure it out. I am on the subcommittee and I agree with what Tim said."

Committeewoman Rubenstein: "My final statement, social media has gotten out of control. People are vicious and unfortunately it has come to Wyckoff Moms. I can't even be on Wyckoff Moms anymore, because I can't stand listening to people cut other people down like that. We talk about bullying in our schools, there is a lot of bullying on our social media. I plead with everyone in town to please make that stop, let it be about finding a plumber and a contractor. Let it stop on social media."

WHEREAS, the Township of Wyckoff has been advised it is the recipient of a grant in the amount of \$217,000.00 for reconstruction of a section of Greenwood Avenue; and,

WHEREAS, the Township of Wyckoff, shall enter into a contract with the State of New Jersey Transportation Trust Fund Municipal Aid Formula Program to participate in the receipt of grant funds made available; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff, County of Bergen, as follows:

SECTION 1. The Township of Wyckoff, in the County of Bergen shall proceed with the improvement of a section of Greenwood Avenue in the Township of Wyckoff with a New Jersey Department of Transportation Trust Fund Grant for \$217,000.00 and engineering design and construction inspection from the general capital improvement fund.

SECTION 2. The cost of implementing said improvements set forth in Section 1 shall be paid by the Township out of funds to be received specifically for said purpose through the State of New Jersey Transportation Trust Fund Municipal Aid Formula Program.

SECTION 3. It is hereby determined and stated:

- b. It is not necessary to finance this authorization by the issuance of obligations by the Township of Wyckoff pursuant to the Local Bond Law of the State of New Jersey.
- c. The total authorized appropriation in this ordinance is \$217,000.00.

SECTION 4. The monies which the Township of Wyckoff is authorized to receive pursuant to the terms of the New Jersey Department of Transportation Trust Fund Grant shall, when received.

SECTION 5. It is hereby determined and stated that no Supplemental debt statement is required to be made and signed in connection with said purpose, since the gross debt of the Township of Wyckoff as defined under the Local Bond Law is not increased by this Ordinance, and no obligations in the matter of notes or bonds are authorized by this ordinance.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance shall take effect after publication thereof and final passage as required by law.



Suicide attempts by LGB youth and questioning youth are 4 to 6 times more likely to result in injury, poisoning, or overdose that requires treatment from a doctor or nurse, compared to their straight peers.
