The Wyckoff Township Committee may convene an emergency public meeting this evening, March 24, 2016 with an affirmative vote of three-quarters of the members present at 7:00 p.m. in the Municipal Court Room, 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor, Wyckoff Town Hall, 340 Franklin Avenue, Wyckoff, New Jersey 07481 on an important and urgent matter which has arisen today and a delay of the meeting would likely result in substantial harm to the public interest. This discussion is a personnel issue and anticipated litigation which impacts the operation of the police department which has a direct effect on health, safety and welfare of residents ensuring the proper working of the police department entrusted with securing the safety of residents.

The purpose of the emergency meeting is for the Township Committee to immediately adopt a resolution to enter into a Closed Session discussion to address a personnel matter, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12(b) (8) regarding the Wyckoff Police Chief and N.J.S.A. 10:4-123(b)(7) Anticipated Litigation.

The need for such meeting could not have been reasonably foreseen at a time when adequate notice could have been provided since the Township learned of such issue this afternoon.

Discussion is limited to this matter only No other business shall be discussed.
